


Mobile Food Distribution September 3rd & September 24th

The Shroud of Turin





Cypress Creek Christian Community Center invites you to attend a free lecture on the Shroud of Turin that will take place on Thursday, September 8, 2022, 7 – 8 PM at the Cypress Creek Community Center's Centrum Auditorium, 6823 Cypresswood, in Spring. The Shroud of Turin is an ancient linen cloth, which holds a mysterious image of a scourged and crucified man. The Shroud is believed to have covered Christ's body in the tomb.

This presentation is co-sponsored by the <u>National Museum of Funeral History</u> in anticipation of the upcoming permanent exhibit The Shroud of Turin: The Most Famous Burial of All Time.'

The presenter is Fr. Andrew Dalton, a Catholic Priest of the Legionaries of Christ and an international Shroud speaker. He is an assistant professor of Biblical Theology of the Passion of Christ at the <u>Pontifical Athenaeum Regina Apostolorum</u> in Rome, Italy. Fr. Dalton is on the Board of Directors of Orthonia, the international organization committed to the promotion and dissemination of knowledge relating to the Shroud of Turin. An Atlanta, GA native, Fr. Dalton has lectured all over the world, emphasizing the evangelical opportunity Shroud science affords. According to Fr. Dalton, "...the most rigorous science continues to champion a cloth that signals the central mysteries of Christian faith...the Incarnation and the Resurrection."

Public Education and You

On August 3, 2022 the "Pastors For Texas Children" held a public forum titled "Public Education and You" at Spring Creek Barbecue. Faith leaders, school administrators, and interested citizens packed the meeting room to hear a report on the current state of public education and school board elections.

Speakers at the "Public Education and You" event (left to right in the photo) were Rev. Glenn Wilkerson, founder of ARK (Adults Relating to Kids); Troy Reynolds, former principal who founded Texans for Public Education; Anne Vallette, retired director of the Klein Educational Foundation; Rev. Charlie Johnson, founder of Pastors for Texas Children; and Rev. Dr. John Ogletree, pastor of the Metropolitan Baptist Church and a former CyFair ISD school board member.

One of the members of the Spring Interfaith Council, Nancy Agafitei, attended this forum and she reports School Board elections used to be low on everyone's radar, but this should no longer be the case. During the last election cycle, established board members were challenged by candidates who wanted to control curriculum, censor textbooks and libraries, and advocate for vouchers for private schools. In the Cy-Fair district, such challengers were elected into office by only 11% of eligible voters. As a result of such actions, pastors across Texas are uniting to make sure that voters are aware of the issues at stake for public education.


It will be available for viewing through September.
