The next **Spring Interfaith Council Planning Meeting** will be held on **Thursday, March 14**th **at 10 AM** in the home of Anais Watsky, 17814 Running Brook Lane, Spring, TX 77379. **Everyone is invited to attend this important gathering.**

The most critical items on the agenda will be the adoption of the documents that will provide more structure to this group, plus the election of five officers. The draft of these documents are included at the end of this newsletter for your review. Please read them in advance before you attend the meeting. - 1) **Articles of Organization -** This document states that Spring Interfaith Council will operate in the state of Texas as an unincorporated nonprofit association. (See Page 20 of this newsletter for the proposed document.)
- 2) **Bylaws for the Spring Interfaith Council -** (See Page 22 of this newsletter for the proposed document.)

After adopting these two documents, the group will elect its officers: a Chair; Vice Chair for Internal Communications; Vice-Chair for External Communications; a Secretary; and a Treasurer. Duties of each officer are listed in the bylaws. If you are willing to serve in any of these positions, please email nancy.agafitei@gmail.com. If you want to nominate someone else for one of the positions, please seek their permission in advance of the meeting, and send Nancy their name(s).

This process of developing more structure for the Spring Interfaith Council has been in the works for a while. It is important for the continuity of the association, and for some practical reasons such as establishing a bank account. Your help is appreciated in assisting the group to take these next steps.

Spring Interfaith Dialogue Week

In 2023, the Spring Interfaith Council re-started its practice of offering opportunities for safe dialogue on interfaith issues over a shared meal in a home setting. It was a very meaningful experience for all involved and we will repeat it again during the week of Sunday, May 12 to Saturday, May 18. During this week, hosts will serve a simple breakfast, lunch, or dinner meal to 8 to12 guests, and moderators will help guide discussion on the thought-provoking questions provided. We are currently in the process of recruiting hosts and moderators, so that in April we can offer a schedule of choices for all guests to pick a convenient time. Opportunities for Prayer

Prayer is an important part of all faith communities. This year the Spring Interfaith Council is planning two opportunities for people of various faiths to join together in prayer.

Prayer Walk – May 2, 2024: The Spring Interfaith Council will once again host a Prayer Walk on the National Day of Prayer (May 2, 2024) to pray for various issues in our community and the world. This short walk will be held entirely on the grounds of Cypress Creek Christian Church, 6823 Cypresswood Dr, Spring, TX 77379.

Along walk route there will be "prayer stations". Various community organizations or faith communities will host these "prayer stations". As the walkers arrive at a station, the walkers will stop and pray for a specific need or concern of our community.

Last year the following faith communities/organizations hosted a prayer station: Open Wide Our Hearts, St. Ignatius Catholic Church, Hosanna Lutheran Church, Holy Comforter Episcopal Church, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, The Hope Center Houston, Prayers Heard in Heaven Prayer Group, St. Dunstan's

A Unique Opportunity to Collaborate with the Indigenous Community

We are excited to announce that a new community-wide program offering opportunities to participate in conversation and in healing and reconciliation circles for both Native and Non-Native Americans is coming to our area. This is a four day event called "Healing the Wounds: An Intercultural Interfaith Gathering". It will be presented by Red Nations Rising and it will be held **on Thursday, April 18 to Sunday, April 21**. It will take place at the Agape Church for the Soul, Mind and Body, 12244 Serenity Rose Dr., Conroe, TX 77304.

A 32-ft tipi with a central fire will be the site for the morning and afternoon healing circles each day. These will be led by therapists, pastors, and indigenous elders. In the evening, educational programs and workshops for a general audience will be held in buildings at the retreat center. All activities will be free of charge for those attending.








Women's Voices



SPRING INTERFAITH COUNCIL BYLAWS

(Draft Approved by Bylaws Committee 1/23/2024)

Article I: Organization

A. The Spring Interfaith Council is an unincorporated nonprofit association under the laws of the state of Texas, Uniform Unincorporated Nonprofit Association Act, Chapter 252 of the Texas Business Organization Code.

Article II: Purpose

A. The Spring Interfaith Council sees a world where people are united for understanding. It consists of volunteers from diverse faiths and cultural communities in the Spring, Texas area who seek to promote respect and understanding among all people, build meaningful relationships, and encourage dialogue. We bring people together to worship, learn, and engage in service to the community. We welcome all who share in this mission.

Article III: Membership in the Spring Interfaith Council (SIC)

- A. The Spring Interfaith Council serves the broader community of all faiths in the Spring area of Northwest Harris County, Texas.
- B. The Spring Interfaith Council is the group of volunteers that meets on a regular basis to plan and coordinate interfaith activities for the Spring area. Any faith community that wants to send participants to the council is encouraged to do so as long as those persons embody the spirit of the SIC's mission and understand that at Council meetings they represent the good of the entire interfaith community.
- C. Individuals who are not affiliated with any faith group are also welcome to participate in the SIC as long as they accept the mission of the organization.
- D. Members are expected to support the organization in these ways:
 - 1. Attend periodic council meetings and sponsored events.
 - 2. Communicate interfaith activities to their own faith community.
 - 3. Communicate their faith community's interfaith activities and programs to the SIC so that they can be promoted to the general community.
 - 4. Be willing to sponsor and/or donate funds to interfaith events such as Thanksgiving services, dialogue opportunities, lectures, book discussions, service projects, and other programs.

Article IV: Officers

- A. The Spring Interfaith Council Officers consist of 5 elected leaders that promote the goals of the SIC and provide for the continuity of the Spring Interfaith Council.
- B. The Officers must represent at least two different faith communities, and no two members of the SIC Officers shall come from the same denomination.
- C. The officers will be nominated from the floor at a meeting during the first quarter of the fiscal year. The SIC year is defined as Jan. 1 to Dec. 31. Officers are elected by majority vote of those present and voting at that meeting.

- D. Officers will serve 2-year terms. The Chair, VP for External Communications, and the Treasurer will be elected in odd years. The VP for Internal Communications and the Secretary will be elected in even years. In the first election of the Officers of this organization, the VP for Internal Communications and the Secretary will be elected to serve 1-year terms.
- E. Officers can be elected to consecutive terms with no term limits. If an Officer should leave or resign before his/her term has expired, the position will be filled at the next meeting through nomination from the Council floor for the remainder of the term.

F. Duties of Officers

- 1. The Chair The Chair sets the agenda and presides at the regular meetings of the SIC. The Chair oversees and coordinates the work of the other Officers. The Chair organizes any SIC public response to local, national or international events, by soliciting the response from faith leaders and then working with the VP of External Communications to disseminate it to the public.
- 2. The Vice President for Internal Communications is responsible for making sure that information is collected, edited, and distributed for regular issues of an interfaith newsletter. This Officer maintains the database of the SIC representatives, as well as the newsletter distribution list, and presides at the SIC meetings in the Chair's absence.
- 3. The Vice President for External Communications is responsible for making sure the SIC Facebook page and website are maintained. This Officer works with the Chair to disseminate any SIC response to local, national or international events to the public. This Officer coordinates public relations

for SIC events, and presides at the SIC meetings in the absence of the Chair and the VP for Internal Communications.

- 4. The Secretary is responsible for taking minutes at all SIC meetings, distributing them to the membership, and maintaining a historical record.
- 5. The Treasurer is responsible for maintaining a bank account for the organization, handling all receipts and disbursements, and reporting all financial transactions to the Council at each regular meeting.

Article V: Administrative Requirements and Policies

A. Finances

- 1. The fiscal year of the SIC will run from January 1 to December 31.
- 2. The SIC is authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the SIC's mission.

B. Amendments to Spring Interfaith Council Bylaws

1. Any changes to these Bylaws may be proposed by any member at any meeting of the Spring Interfaith Council. The proposal must be circulated to all members through email in advance of the next SIC meeting. The proposed changes will be voted on by those representatives present at the next meeting of the Council. To be adopted, they must receive more than a majority vote. Changes adopted will be effective at the close of the meeting.

C. Dissolution

1. In the event of the dissolution of the Spring Interfaith Council as an unincorporated nonprofit association, after paying any debts and obligations of the association, the remaining assets shall be distributed to an organization in the Spring area exempt under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, as determined by the majority vote of the members present and voting at the last meeting of the association. No member of the SIC shall be entitled to share in any assets upon the dissolution of the association.
